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November 24, 2025 (Dallas, TX) – On October 3, 2025, Metrocare became aware of an unauthorized data sharing event containing the protected health information (PHI) of 8,599 clients. A Metrocare employee sent an email, which included PHI, outside the Metrocare network to their personal email. The email was encrypted and shared, without permission from Metrocare, to an unauthorized network. Our investigation determined that the unauthorized disclosure occurred on September 9, 2025. The information disclosed was limited to first and last name, Medical Record Numbers (MRN), date/duration/cost of service, practitioner name and appointment start and end time.

We thoroughly investigated this incident and worked with the employee to ensure the email was deleted from the inbox and the trash folders. There is no evidence that the PHI shared was used in any way by anyone other than the one individual authorized to have the information. Further, based on our investigation, there is no evidence that any third party accessed any of the information. As always, Metrocare is committed to protecting our clients' privacy and personal information. Privacy policies and procedures are in place and agency staff will continue ongoing training on best practices, rules and requirements.
